AUCTION RULES, TERMS & CONDITIONS

In compliance with the Governor's "Stay Home Stay Healthy" orders, we must limit the number of people allowed into the auction area during such time. As our state progresses through the Phases of reopening, the amount will increase. **RCW 43.06.220**

Enter at your own risk. We are not responsible or liable for any personal injury due to slips, falls, cuts, pokes, scratches, etc. You assume all risk of personal injury while on the premises. Auction cars can have broken glass, exposed sharp metal edges, hypodermic needles, razors, and/or other potential hazards.

Upon purchase of an auction vehicle, the identification that you use to sign into the auction, must be the name and address that the vehicle is registered to.

No children under the age of 16 are allowed in the auction yard. Children 16 and above must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian. The parent or legal guardian must assume all responsibility of the minor. Minors are not permitted to bid.

Anyone who wishes to enter the auction yard to view or bid on vehicles will agree to these rules, terms, and conditions. No backpacks, cell phones, coolers, etc.

Do not remove any items from the vehicles. This is considered theft. The police will be called, and we will press charges. Any person caught stealing items from vehicles will be banned from attending any future auctions. We have a zero policy on theft.

Stay in the auction area. Do not enter restricted areas. Do not touch or inspect vehicles that are not included in the auction. All vehicles are sold as is, where is. All sales are final. We do not allow mechanical repairs to be done in the auction yard.

Payment is required within two hours after the end of the auction. We accept cash only as payment. Violation of the payment policy results in forfeiture of your bid and suspension or banishment from future auctions. Sales tax will be charged on all sales.

Vehicles must be removed with 24 hours unless prior arrangements have been made. Violation of this policy will result in forfeiture of your bid and suspension or banishment from future auctions, and vehicle will be impounded after 48 hours.

In the case the highest bidder defaults (or otherwise forfeits his/her bid) the next bidder has the right to purchase the vehicle for his/her bid.

The successful bidder must apply for title within fifteen days unless provided otherwise by law.

RCW 46.55.130 (21)

We can refuse to accept a bid for any reason posted in our rules, terms & conditions, and for any of the following reasons: (A) The bidder is currently indebted to the operator; (B) The operator has knowledge that the bidder has previously abandoned vehicles purchased at auction:; or (C) The bidder has purchased at auction, more than four vehicles in the last calendar year without obtaining a title to any or all of the vehicles. **RCW 46.55.130 (3)**
